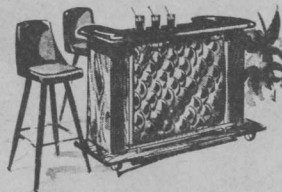

G: Who created the name?



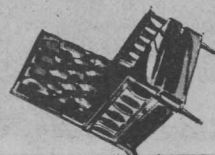
SMART MODERN BAR
